From the Minister

When it is all over...



The day after. The week. The month. Handling our elation or disappointment after November 8 will be challenging. How we manage our exhaustion, enthusiasm, anxieties, fears and certainty is a spiritual discipline. It requires attention as individuals, as well as a church and a nation of citizens.

Unitarian Universalists have tools for moving forward when all feels broken. We also have skills for times when all feels just right. They are really the same tools. We view the world as inter-

connected. Everything we do falls from that position.

How does this work after an endless election cycle that increasingly divided families, co-workers, politicians, and playgrounds?

We begin with ourselves. We are gentle with ourselves. We pay attention to all the feelings that arise. We notice and name. We rest, if rest is needed. We get active, when motion and change are required.

Next we give the same generous attention and space to others around us. Just another version of you. While Uncle Frank may have stood for everything you oppose, you can begin to see parts of his life echo your own. You begin to see other ways Aunt Lucy is actually living a life with courage. You rediscover the humanity in some you have called your "enemy."

It is seductive to reject all who have been insensitive, dishonest, bullying, or dismissive. Yet, we are tasked to see the humanity in all, especially when they are wrongheaded, stupid, and hurtful. Why? Because we too have been these corrupt things and likely will again in our lifetime or in the next hour. As the Buddhist tradition reminds us, "Your enemy is your precious teacher."

Make a fresh, rich-with-possibilities start. Peel off any old bumper stickers. Pull out dated yard signs. Clean out your Facebook and Twitter feed. Consider replacing them all with, "Just another version of you." The phrase borrowed from producer and activist Norman Lear captures an aspect of Universalism. We human creatures are in this life together. We are more alike than different.

What is different now? Anything? What did the election show us about ourselves that need attention and revising first? What do we see in our communities? How do we create ways to stay involved and connected with each other for the long haul



October Theme—Emotional Intelligence



Our feelings demand two kinds of attention. First, they are helpful facts. Each passing feeling gives us data into our personal response to any given moment. Emotional intelligence means being able to notice and name your feelings.

Since not every person will have the same feeling in the same situation, an emotion is also transient and varies in intensity. No

single feeling comes and stays forever. The second part of emotional intelligence is noticing this temporariness and ebb and flow. Emotional maturity is learning when to take action spurred by an emotion and when to wait for it to pass.

We talk about this as a church community because how we handle our feelings affects how we interact with each other. Emotional intelligence is learned. It is shaped by family patterns. Join us as we explore emotional intelligence as individuals and as a community.

Garden and Grounds

It has officially been Fall for some weeks now, but so far the weather Gods haven't seemed to notice. It is way too warm and way too dry for the optimum comfort of many humans. It is dusty underfoot and some leaves are falling early. Only a few late flowers offer nectar to a lingering butterfly. The sumac is red in the woods.

There will be a new retaining wall, privacy fences (to screen the equipment), benches and (someday) a garden area. Old fences will come down, the bushes will be pruned back and Susan wants a pained labyrinth. I see (someday) with some rock repositioning and a path by the rain garden, that it could connect invitingly to the existing main back patio and be another outdoor area for everyone to use at church events.


